Stonehenge Class Assembly -

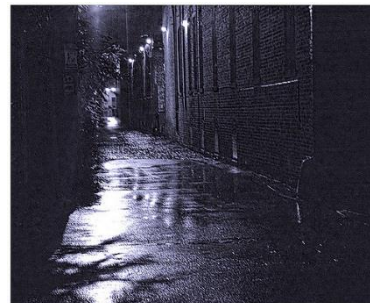

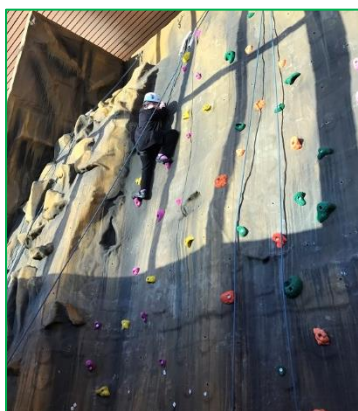
