Useful Information:

Conjunctivitis - Infective conjunctivitis typically involves red or pink eyes that may be sticky or watery and can cause irritation, although the condition is usually pain free. Most cases clear up within a few days without any treatment.



You **DON'T** need to

- See a GP
- Use antibiotics
- Keep them away from school

You **DO** need to:

- Bathe the eyes regularly
- Keep their eyes uncovered
- Discourage them from touching their eyes.
- Encourage hand hygiene
- Make sure they use their own towels and pillows
- Buy lubricant eye drops from the pharmacist in severe cases.
