There was mind-reading, fun & games from a certain wizard called Potter, and our 'Maths Cauldron' game this week...

This week was another cracking week of magical maths. In fact, this week was PARTICULARLY magical, as we had a guest appearance from our very own Mathemagician. He had an amazing time with the children, and taught them some really exciting stuff!

#### Maths WHIZZards

One of the activities this week feature some super fun 'maths showdowns' in our Maths WHIZZards game (based on a scene from a famous film about young whizzards!). **Children had to test their speed in this game.** 

This game helps children with a variety of important areas. Key Stage I focused on recalling and using addition/subtraction facts up to 100 and telling and writing important times on a clock face. Key Stage 2 focused on fractions.

We eventually whittled down to the winning teams, who were very pleased. Well done guys!

#### Magic Cauldron for the Key Stage 1s & The Mathemagician Training Booklet for Key Stage 2s

This activity is great one. It's called the 'Magic Cauldron' and really helps students with the speed of their sums. They have to pick a card and select another card



with the correct answer on. There will be a magic ingredient on the back, which they must add to their cauldron to make a secret potion!

The first to get all the ingredients wins the game (AND has their very own magic potion...double cool!)!

This week, if your child is in Key Stage 2 they should have brought home their Magician Training Booklet. Here's what it looked like...

This booklet will train them how to perform some of the Mathemagian's maths tricks. It features some timeless classics such as 'Think of a Number' and the 'Answer out of a Hat Card Trick', and also our personal favourite 'Think of an Animal'.

Your child needs to practise these until they stick. Repetition, along with a bit of showmanship, are what the mathemagician prescribes for making these tricks super slick.

### Time Bamb for Key Stage Is & Magic Dice for Key Stage 2s

<u>Time Bamb</u> – A great game for teaching number patterns and basic times tables. The children stand in a circle and must say either 1, 2 or 3 consecutive numbers in a sequence that we give them. The next child then continues on from there, and so on, and so on. When one child reaches the last number in the sequence, they must make a big (pretend) explosion and sit down. We continue until we're left with a champion. We also played this game with times tables! The Mathemagician was very impressed with their little apprentices.

<u>Magic Dice -</u> A game featuring two 12-sided dice, and three 6-sided dice. The children get split into teams, and each team rolls their 12-sided dice to create their 'target'. Using the number they then roll from the 6-sided dice, children can use add, subtract, multiply, divide and even powers (for the older children) to equal their target. This activity is perfect for encouraging strategic thinking and problem solving!
