flying machines out of junk and


testing them in an air tunnel. The children all behaved themselves brilliantly and were excellent representatives for Fair Furlang Primary School.



Musical Literacy Day - This week we had Thundering

Music Thursday. It was a day to inspire and learn more about different types of music.

In the morning we listened to a piece of music and thought about how it made us feel and why. Then, we used this in our literacy to help us write stories, settings and more. In the afternoon we compared pieces of music for tempo, rhythm and then composed our own.



Bikeability - Same of our year 3/4 children took part in a bikeability course on Wednesday. Bikeability is today's cycle training programme. It's like cycling proficiency, but better! It's about gaining practical skills and understanding how to cycle on today's roads. Bikeability gives everyone the skills and confidence for all kinds of cycling. Level 1

At Level I new riders learn to control and master their bikes in a space away from traffic such as a playground or closed car park. Prepare yourself and your bike for cycling

- get on and off your bike without help
- start off, pedal and stop with control
- · pedal along, use gears and avoid objects
- · look all around and behind, and control the bike
- share space with pedestrians and other cyclists

Year I DT Day - On Wednesday year one enjoyed a whole day of DT! We used the iPads to research houses that have already been built to find out what they were made of and to get some ideas of what we liked. We then looked at all the tools and materials that we had in school and decided which ones would be most appropriate. Our science experiment helped us to choose a suitable waterproof material. Designing was next and we thought very carefully about how we wanted it to look! Then came the making! We used saws to safely cut our wood to size and will now hammer nails in to put it all together.
