IN COOKING CLUB this week the children made Hummus – as you can see the recipe is really easy and everyone agreed that it was a delicious dish.

**RECIPE** – 400g tin chickpeas; 2 cloves garlic; 2 table spoons olive oil; juice of ½ lemon. Method – Drain and wash the chickpeas and place into a blender. Add oil and lemon juice. Crush or chop the garlic and add. Blend until smooth (add cold water slowly if needed). You could also add diced red pepper or a teaspoon of pesto.
