Lyme disease is the most common tick-borne infectious disease in the northern hemisphere and there are multiple strains of the bacteria. Lyme disease is endemic in many parts of the United Kingdom, particularly in woodland or heath-land areas but disease carrying ticks can also be found in cities and gardens.



Symptoms can start with a rash, often described as a bulls-eye

rash, It's important to note that not every Lyme disease patient will experience or remember a rash The rash may not appear straight away. Other symptoms of Lyme disease can include malaise, flu-like symptoms, soreness and achiness, light and noise sensitivity, cogntitive problems, fatigue, a stiff neck, facial palsy, numbness and tingling.
