




Thank you very much to all the parents who attended our consultation meeting on Tuesday 21st May to review our revised PSHE curriculum.

The response was very positive and we will be rolling out the new Changing Me topic in Term 6. Your children will receive a letter nearer the time to inform you when the lessons will start and the content.

The new curriculum that will be covered in the Changing Me topic in Term 6 includes areas such as puberty, naming body parts (internal and external), exploring changes as children move through puberty (both physical and emotional), life cycles, attraction and conception. All are planned to be taught at an age appropriate level, and therefore children may/may not cover the above areas depending on their year group.

DATA PROTECTION REGULATION - You may not be aware but the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) comes into force in May 2018. As part of our preparations we are conducting due diligence for all parents to be aware of the new regulation and how it affects their child and the way the school deals with their personal data.
