






This week Seoul Class have made their own scarecrow museum to start exploring harvest.

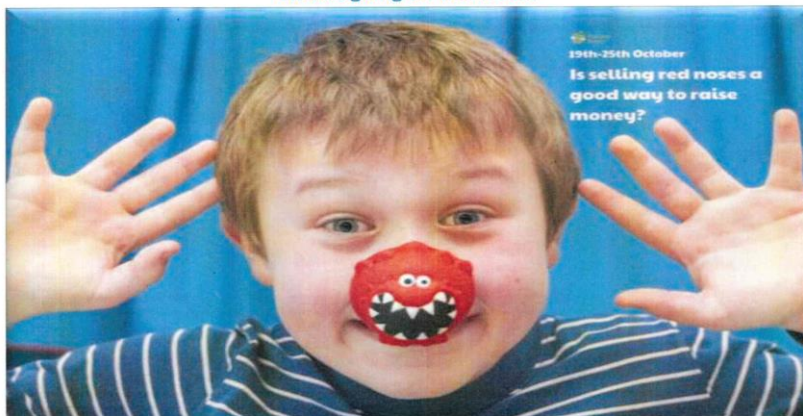

Comic Relief has announced that from 2021 its red noses will be plastic-free for the first time. The new noses will be made from bagasse, a natural by-product of sugar cane, and take more than 18 months to create! The charity, which "strives to create a just world free from poverty", made the change after it received letters and emails from the children of Furlanessend Community Primary School asking them to create a plastic-free version of the nose to help reduce plastic waste.

DATA PROTECTION REGULATION - You may not be aware but the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) came into force in May 2018. We are required to conduct due diligence for all parents to be aware of the regulation and how it affects their child and the way the school deals with their personal data.
