

DATA PROTECTION REGULATION - You may not be aware but the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) came into force in May 2018. We are required to conduct due diligence for all parents to be aware of the regulation and how it affects their child and the way the school deals with their personal data. A German professor believes that secure playgrounds prevent young people from finding out important dangers during their early years. Rolf Schwarz, from Karlsruhe College of Schooling in Germany, argued that 'we want to permit youngsters to return into touch with threat'. Built in 2018, a very high climbing tower, with many risky obstacles in Berlin-Frohnau's Ludwig Lesser Park is an example of a trend that has become popular in Germany over the last five years. *Things to talk about at home...*
